In car driving instruction is scheduled individually by the instructor. Driving times will be available during and after school, some evenings, and some weekends. Students should get roughly 1-2 hours per week of driving time with the instructor, depending on the length of the course.

Students must complete 16 projects throughout the course. These projects are due as requested by the instructor. In addition to these assignments, students must also complete an additional homework sheet pertaining to the number of behind-the-wheel hours they have completed. Assignments due must be handed in at the beginning of the designated class. Failure to complete any assignment by the due date will result in an additional assignment for that day. By law, students are allowed to miss a total of 4 hours (2 classes) for any reason; therefore, absences that result from non-preparation will greatly affect the student's ability to successfully complete the driver education course.

Students will take multiple exams and short quizzes during the driver education course. There are unit exams, and 2 final exams. Students must complete the course with an average of at least 80. Students must score at least an 80 on both of the finals. One make up per final exam will be allowed. Students must also hand in their course notebook as listed on the classroom schedule. Please note that students are responsible for all material covered in class, even if they are absent.

Students who fail to comply with the requirements listed above will not pass the course and must retake the course at full cost. There is no guarantee of success; however, students who apply themselves and follow the guidelines for the course should have no problems passing. Remember that driving in NH is a privilege and not a right. Students must demonstrate maturity and responsibility in order to obtain a license. Finally, cooperation between the instructor, student and parent is critical for success. Any problems/issues should be addressed in a timely manner so they can be dealt with adequately. If students wait until the last minute to voice concerns, it may be too late to solve their particular problem. Feel free to contact me if you have any questions or concerns.
